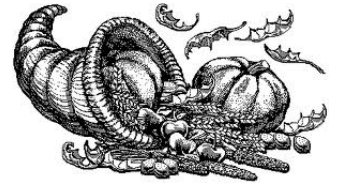


# *Lasqueti Island Fall Fair*
